



Klein Scores Top Ten at Freedom 100

Long Grove, IL (May 26, 2007) - Jonathan Klein finished in the Top Ten for the second time in three starts in the 2007 Indy Pro Series. The race on Friday, May 25, at the famed Indianapolis Motor Speedway was Klein's first run on an oval for 2007, having just signed with Team Moore Racing to compete in all of the remaining IPS oval races this year. Team Moore Racing had just completed assembly of a new race car and rolled it onto the track for the first time for Thursday's first practice session at the Speedway. Team co-owner and engineer Mark Moore worked incredibly hard along with the crew to give Jonathan a competitive race car, and although by Thursday afternoon's qualifying session the car was handling very well, the car wasn't yet up to speed. For the first time in his career, Klein started the race at the back of the pack in last place.

Klein wasn't content to stay at the back for too long. By turn two of the first lap, he had moved up eleven spots, running high on the outside to gain positions. He got as high as eighth, and finished in the tenth spot as the race ended with the last four laps under the yellow flag for rain conditions.

"Everyone worked so hard to get ready for this race. I think we proved we are highly capable as a team. We worked well under not only the pressure of running at Indy, but also to get a completely new car prepared and ready to race. I am really looking forward to running at Milwaukee next week."

The Indy Pro Race at the Milwaukee Mile will be run on Saturday, June 2 at 5:15 pm. The race is scheduled for broadcast on ESPN2, June 7 at 6:00 pm Eastern time.
